COVID-19 Update

Revelation/Blackjewel Bankruptcy


- In 2019, Revelation/BlackJewel et. al. filed for Chapter 11 protection in US Bankruptcy Court in the Southern District of West Virginia.
 - ▶ The bankruptcy encompassed more than two-hundred (200) permits in the Eastern Kentucky Coal Fields.
 - After almost two years of meetings, motions, and court appearances, the bankruptcy court issued its Confirmation Order.
- On March 22, 2021, a Final Confirmation plan was entered that required:
 - Purchasers of permits from the bankruptcy sale to submit and obtain permit transfers.
 - ▶ The remaining permits not purchased were revoked pursuant to an Agreed Order entered on June 11, 2021 with the Cabinet's Office of Administrative Hearings.
 - The Cabinet has entered into a "Surety Reclamation Agreement" with Indemnity National Insurance Company to reclaim the remaining permits.



Director, Division of Mine Permits – Wes Jones

- ▶ On October 6, 2021, Wes Jones was named the Executive Director of the Division of Mine Permits.
 - Wes first started work with the Division in 1985 and has served in several divisions within the Department, as well as working in the coal industry.
 - Wes has a bachelor's degree in Mining Engineering from the University of Kentucky.

The Energy & Environment Cabinet is very pleased with the leadership and experience Wes brings to the Division of Mine Permits.





Executive Director, Office of Reclamation Guaranty Fund – Jeff O'Dell

- ▶ On December 8, 2021, Jeff O'Dell was named the Executive Director of the Office of the Office of the Reclamation Guaranty Fund (KRGF).
 - ▶ Jeff started work with the Department in 1988 as a reclamation inspector and has served in several divisions within the Department, as well as serving with the KRGF when it was first stood up.
 - ▶ Jeff has a degree in Environmental Science from Morehead State University

Initiatives and Accomplishments

▶ DNR is working with the Office of Administrative Services (OAS) to upgrade the current electronic work-flow to a more stable environment.



Reminders

- Division of Mine Permits
 - ▶ Ensure renewal applications are submitted at least 120 days prior to expiration.
 - Permitting fees must be submitted with the all applicable applications upon initial submittal.
 - Renewal applications must include the bonds and liability insurance at the time of initial submittal.
- Division of Mine Reclamation and Enforcement
 - Stay contemporaneous.
 - Ensure ponds and associated diversions are maintained in accordance with the approved permit package and applicable regulations.
- KY Reclamation Guarantee Fund: Ensure fees are submitted by the appropriate deadlines. Failure to submit fees may cause your permits to be suspended.
- Division of Mine Safety: Ensure all applicable mine license and fees are submitted in a timely manner.
