CPP – January 2008

CPP – July 21, 2010

 "Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid said Thursday that neither he nor the White House had managed to line up 60 senators to support even a limited proposal seeking to cap carbon-dioxide emissions from electric power companies." – WSJ, 7/22/2010



CPP – June 25, 2013



"So today, for the sake of our children, and the health and safety of all Americans, I'm directing the **Environmental Protection** Agency to put an end to the limitless dumping of carbon pollution from our power plants, and complete new pollution standards for both new and existing power plants." - Pres. Obama, **Georgetown University**

CPP – December 2, 2014


- Final CPP / GHG Regs Released
- Awaiting the Federal Register?
- U.S. Court of Appeals at D.C. Circuit rejects the request of 15 states for a stay of CPP
- Paris Climate Conference Early December
 2015
- Utilities are making decisions now with our litigation pending

<u>Proposed</u> CPP – Economic Fallout – Kentucky

- 10% increase in cost of electricity
- \$2 billion loss in Kentucky's GDP
- Job losses
- Higher natural gas prices
- Increases in renewable energy
- Threats to grid reliability and stability
- Stranded utility investments

CPP – Economic Fallout – NERA Analysis

- 43 states will have double digit electricity price increases
- 14 states will have peak-year increases greater than 20%
- Estimated annual cost of \$41 billion to \$73 billion
- Compliance costs of \$366 billion to \$479 billion
- Additional coal retirements of at least 45K MW
- Coal-fired generation will decrease at least 29%
- Natural gas prices increase from 2% to 29%



CPP – What It Will Do

- Global CO2 concentrations will be reduced by less than .5%
- Global average temperature rise will be reduced by 0.016 degree F (less than 2/100^{ths} of a degree)
- Sea level rise will be reduced by .03 millimeter (1/100th inch or the thickness of three sheets of paper)

Emission reductions from EPA's proposal and AEO 2014 are accumulated and scaled to projected emissions reductions and resulting climate effects from EPA's Regulatory Impact Analysis: Final Rulemaking for 2017-2025 Light-Duty Vehicle Greenhouse Gas Emission Standards and Corporate Average Fuel Economy Standards, August 2012, page 4-134 and 6-112.


CPP – Current Criticism

- Governors & AGs from at least 33 states have expressed opposition
- Majority of Congress
- Grid operators have expressed concerns about negative impacts on grid reliability
- Many more legal challenges will be filed by states and others once the final rule is published in the Federal Register

CPP – Summary of Problems

- EPA Lacks legal authority
- EPA is usurping state authority
- Electricity prices will increase
- Natural gas prices will increase
- Electric reliability will be threatened
- The are no climate change benefits with CPP
