





It is a green field project based on a copper-goldmolybdenum porphyry deposit, which is considered to be the largest deposit of its kind in the world.



SME Current Initiatives: Education Sustainability

The proposed actions are two-fold:

- 1. 4-year graduate fellowship for Ph.D. students (\$60K/yr)
- 2. Career Grants intended to assist new faculty. (\$100k/yr)





Current Initiatives: Health & Safety

- Board started H&S Committee under the 2013 presidency of Dr. Jessica Elzea Kogel
- Committee's core purpose is to be the primary resource and advocate for mine safety and health.
- Endorsed NMA's CORESAFETY. program
- 2015 SME created Health and Safety Division to increase emphasis & develop programming


