


DMRE Accomplishments


- We have received 465 citizen requests for inspection for FY 2015 which represents a decrease of 14% for FY 2015 as compared to FY 2014.
- Frequency of Inspections as mandated by 405 KAR12:010 is at 99+% for FY 2015.
- The Division has released \$127,411,560 in reclamation bonds for fiscal year 2015. This represents an increase in the amount of bonds released of 2% over the previous fiscal year.
- We have issued 903 non-compliances and 213 cessation orders in FY 2015 which represents a 15% reduction in the number of Notices of non-compliances issued in FY 2015 as compared to 2014 and a 26% reduction in the number of Cessation orders issued in FY 2015 as compared to FY2014.
- We collected \$1,813,937.86 in penalties for FY 2015. This represents a 17% increase in penalties collected for FY 2015 as compared to FY 2014.




This chart shows the overall reduction of mine permits over the past five years.





This chart shows the rate at which we are meeting the frequency requirement in the regulations for conducting mine inspections

This chart shows the four most common violations cited for fiscal year 2015 ending June 30th.




